It will also empower them to sell the vehicles. The city council last night adopted a resolution to place such a measure on the ballot.

Tokio Lost 1,000,000 People.

TOKIO, (AP)—Tokio has dropped from fifth to tenth place among the cities of the world in population as a result of the deaths and evacuations following the earthquake and fire. By the census taken two years ago there were 2,495,000 people in the capital. A census taken November 15 showed but 1,529,618.

The chief of the statistical department of the municipality believes that Tokio will regain her position in about six years.

ARIZONA EXPECTS PROSPEROUS YEAR

PHOENIX, (I.N.S.)—High cotton prices, with a bounteous crop together with successful diversified farming, promise unbounded prosperity for Arizona and the Salt River Valley this year.

The total yield of cotton will go far over the early estimates of 50,000 bales. It is stated on good authority. Early oranges and grapefruit are now going on to the Eastern and European markets; the lettuce crop will soon be ready for harvesting. Farmers and workers are busy hauling cotton to the gins, and merchants of the city are beginning to feel the effect of more money in circulation.

Conditions throughout the state seem more favorable than for months past. F. C. Jackling, head of one of the leading copper producing plants, said recently that the position of copper was as good if not better than that of any other metal.

While the copper market has been slightly under last year's quotations the increased sales have given reassurances that conditions are bettering. None of the large properties has closed down, and all of the mining camps, including the gold camps of northern Arizona, are busy, according to reports reaching the State Mine Inspector's office.

Kansas Boom Seems to Be at Opportune Time; Oil Prices Going Up.

KANSAS CITY, (I.N.S.)—Simultaneous with a prediction that a general slump in oil production is expected in 1924 come murmurs of a "Kansas oil boom" that will make the present year the best in the state's history.

Oil men, particularly the romantic wildcatter, are turning their attention and time to Kansas. Likewise upon developments in the new fields in untried sections of the state depends to a great extent whether the oil industry in general this year will show a decrease in production as predicted.

Already the wildcatters are on the ground looking over the prospects for strikes.

Oil men of other states in the Southwestern fields are anticipating a bad year, but the dream of speculators envision a big production in Kansas to follow up the depressing year of 1923.

New pools discovered in Kansas bring much encouragement to the wildcatter, and increased drilling already has been started. Two big strikes recently have justified added hope.

The excitement started a month ago, when the Valentin Oil company brought in a well making 175 barrels daily and which has held at this average for more than a month. The new well is 150 miles from old oil fields, and is the first of any consequence discovered in the western part of the state.

Boom is on.

Average is being blocked off in all directions from the well, and speculation is expected to open up in this new territory on a large scale.

One oil man has purchased a block of 2,500 acres south of this well and announced that drilling would begin soon. An oil company has purchased two other tracts nearby and will start tests as soon as rigs can be built and tools struck.

Yet even a greater sensation than this strike was the more recent one at Russell, and hundreds of scouts lost no time in making their way to the little town and surrounding territory to block acreage and make preparations for extensions to tests.
