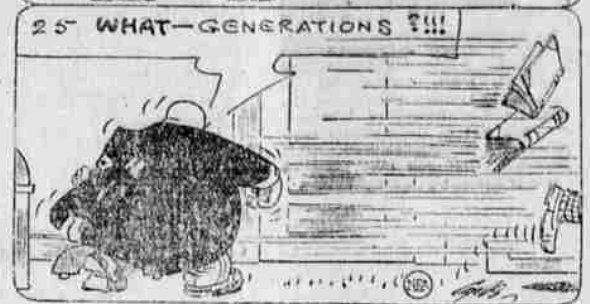
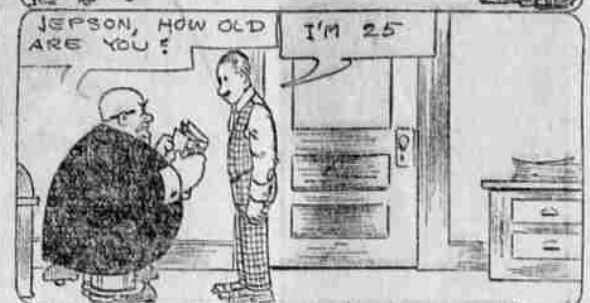
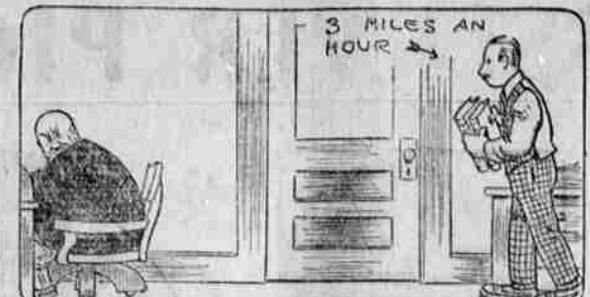

Income Tax Tips

No. 13.
The deduction allowed an employer for salaries or wages of employees is defined by the revenue act as "a reasonable allowance for salaries or other compensation for services actually rendered." Such claims to be allowed must conform to the wording of the statute.

The test of deductibility is whether the amounts paid are reasonable, and whether they are, in fact, purely for personal services. Reasonable compensation is held by the Bureau of Internal Revenue to be paid for like services by like employees in like circumstances.

A person who claims a deduction for wages or salary paid himself should report the amount as income, just as any other wages or salary received. Salaries or wages paid by a parent to a minor child who has not been emancipated, whether in consideration of services or otherwise, are not allowable deductions.

Domestic paid employees may be deducted by the employer when such payments are made in good faith as compensation for services actually rendered, provided that when added to the stipulated salary they do not exceed a reasonable compensation. Such bonuses must be included in the returns of the recipients. Gifts to employees which do not have in them the element of compensation may not be deducted by the employer, and need not be included in the return of the recipient.
