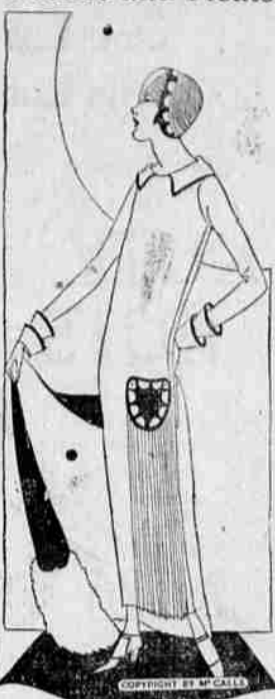

PRINCE CYRIL VISITS BORIS

(By Constantine Stephanov) SOFIA. (INS)—Bulgarian royalty is enjoying the nearest thing to a family reunion permitted since the military debacle in 1918, which drove King Ferdinand and his children, except for King Boris, successor to Ferdinand, from the country.

The reunion has been brought about by the arrival of Prince Cyril, the only brother of King Boris in Sofia. Prince Cyril, who has been in exile in coloring with his father, the former King, arrived unannounced to spend Christmas and New Year's holidays with his brother and his sisters, the Princesses Marie-Louise and Kuzhka, who have been living at the palace for several months.

Bulgarians generally are greatly pleased with the return of the youngest prince of the royal family, who before the war was immensely popular with all classes of Bulgarians. In their youth, not only Prince Cyril but King Boris, then the Crown Prince, and their sisters used to roam in the country among the peasantry and considered themselves to be the main folk that they were known far and wide as "The Children." As a boy Prince Cyril often was dandied on the knee of a peasant mother exactly as were her own "kids."

At the outbreak of the Balkan wars in 1912, however, the happy home life of the royal family came to an end. The two princes joined their regiments and continued in military service through the World War. In October, 1918, Prince Cyril, with his father and two sisters, fled to the West.

WOMAN HELPS NEW MINISTER

By David M. Church LONDON. (INS)—Woman's penetration into British politics has been greater than it appears, for Ramsey MacDonald's confidential secretary is a woman—Miss Irene Rosenburg.

The secrets of the Empire will filter through the hands of this woman and undoubtedly she will keep them.

Macdonald is not without a precedent in selecting a woman for this important post. For Lloyd George's former Prime Minister, had Miss Frances Louise Stevenson as his confidential secretary.

Throughout the war Miss Stevenson kept secrets that might have upset the world and was rewarded with an honor from the King.

Miss Rosenburg, who now enters Downing Street as one of its highest officials, has been in the thick of the labor fight for ten years or more.

London born and London bred, she is a bright and energetic young woman, with a mass of dark hair. She has burned the midnight lamp often and long to gain that knowledge and experience which fits her for the duties she has assumed.

Miss Rosenburg worked diligently for the constitutional suffrage movement long before the women's vote was won. During the war she served on the National Council for Civil Liberties, and she has also served on the headquarters staff of the Labor Party and has acted as secretary to women leaders in public life.

Nearly a year ago Miss Rosenburg became the secretary to Macdonald, then the leader of the Opposition, and in this work she has undoubtedly found her metier, for she has shown an aptitude for political work and has demonstrated a rare sense of tact and sagacity in political affairs.

There is joy in this work for Miss Rosenburg, and she attacks every problem with a vim that shows her interest.

When not at her desk in Macdonald's office she is just a simple English girl, fond of dancing, music, the theatre and the society of her best of friends.

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MELLON TAX PLAN IS APPROVED BY BANKERS LEAGUE

WASHINGTON, D. C. (Special)—Seventy-five leading bankers of the Nation, representing twenty-six states attended the meeting of the American Bankers League here this week called for the purpose of giving consideration to the Mellon Plan of Tax Reduction.

The Convention, after considering the Mellon Plan, unanimously approved it and called on the Ways and Means Committee filing with them their official endorsement of this policy of Government.

Hon. Carter Glass, former Secretary, addressed the bankers meeting and endorsed the principles of the Mellon Plan and vigorously opposed the Soldiers Bonus.

The report filed by the Bankers with the Ways and Means Committee stated that the barrower ultimately pays the tax of the lender, including income and surplus that twenty-five per cent of the profit of any concern is the decline in taxation; that taxation is an economic issue and should be kept out of politics; that our present tax system makes it easy for the public to get out of debt; that the banker would finance agricultural and prod-

five industry if the Mellon Plan is adopted; that Surveys and Income Taxes positively determine the interest rate or point at which capital will flow into productive industries instead of tax exempt securities; and that the bankers of the Nation are ready to join in calling a halt on unlimited bond issues and want to divert capital to productive industries.
