HOOP GAMES TO BE PEPPY

Enterprise and Joseph Contests in La Grande This Week-End Looked Forward to.

(By Scoop) Basketball fans are confidently expecting to witness two of the snappiest games of the season here when Enterprise and Joseph high school teams play La Grande high in the high school gymnasium Friday and Saturday of this week. Enterprise, which La Grande defeated 59 to 22, in hotly contested game since the game two weeks ago and Coach Antinoro is expecting his proteges to present a much stronger front to the Blue and White team here. Enterprise has always put out a fighting team and one defeat merely seems to strengthen their purpose to do better the next time. Which means that Enterprise and La Grande should give the fans a real treat when they meet Friday evening at eight o'clock.

Joseph Team Strong. There is absolutely no doubt but that the Joseph team is one of the strongest in the district. La Grande went down to defeat at Joseph 45 to 23 and the game was no fluke. As far as that goes Joseph has been defeating La Grande for the past few years regularly when the Tigers played on the Joseph floor and La Grande has been turning the tables on them when they played in La Grande. From that viewpoint, it is La Grande's time to win—but if they do it will be at the end of as hard a fought game as they ever played.

After the Joseph, Enterprise games are played La Grande has but three contests before the Union district tournament is begun. Pen-dleton will be played two games and a return game will be played with Union here.

Baker high school's team occupies a position at the top of the ladder at present on a par with Joseph. Baker has not been defeated by a district team, although she lost twice in Umatilla county. The latest victory added to her string was against Prairie City Saturday night. When Winter Comes Filipinos Play Ball

MANTILA, (AP)—The baseball season in the Philippines is now in full swing, and close observers declare that greater interest has been shown in the game than for many years.

The amateur championship of the islands will be decided during the third week in February when the annual carnival is held in Manila. By a process of elimination among the various leagues, not only in Manila but in the outlying provinces, the number of teams will be narrowed down so that the series of games which will decide the championship can be played off in one week.

The army league, made up of teams from each of the five United States army posts in the vicinity of Manila and three civilian teams, has adopted a schedule call-

ing for games on Saturdays and Sundays during the season. The team from the Thirty-first United States Infantry is composed of Americans, two others are made up of Filipinos and American and the remaining teams of the Army League are all Filipino.

vals of 20 minutes in order to test the action of the sewer on the walls. The first trouble occurred at Seventeenth and Commercial streets, where the water washed out a temporary wooden bulkhead and cut into the dirt fill.

Late this afternoon the raking water cut under the concrete sewer tunnel on Fifteenth street, partially filling the tunnel and operations were again suspended temporarily. At intervals of about two blocks temporary drains have been laid

through the sea wall and these are expected to carry off the surplus water. It is expected the fill will be completed in about three weeks and the street will then be ready for paving.
