Blue Law Regime Declared in N. Y. Town; Laws Strict

SYRACUSE, N. Y., (AP)—Back to the days of the Puritans for McGraw, a neighboring village.

Justice P. McGraw, of that town, has founded the death-knell of all Sunday activities—labor, amusements, sports, wagers and even traffic.

Playing, hunting, horse racing, shooting, gaming or other public sports, exercises or shows upon the first day of the week and all unreasonable noises are prohibited.

All wagers, bets or stakes made to depend upon any race or upon any gaming by lot or chance shall be unlawful.

Justice McGraw says that all manner of public selling or offering for sale any property upon Sunday is prohibited, except as follows:

Articles of food may be sold, served, supplied and delivered at any time before 10 o'clock in the morning.

Meats may be sold to be eaten on the premises.

Tobacco, milk, eggs, ice, soda water, fruit, flowers, confectionery, sovents, newspapers, gasoline, oil, tires, drugs, medicines and surgical instruments may be sold in places other than a room where spirits or malt liquors are wines are kept or offered for sale and may be delivered at any time during the day.

Delicatessen dealers may sell, serve and deliver cooked and prepared foods between the hours of 4 p. m. and 7:30 p. m.

Commodities, exposed in violation of the rule will be forfeited and the goods sold on one day's notice by the Justice of the Peace and the proceeds turned over to

NEWSPAPERMEN WILL MEET IN EUGENE SOON

EUGENE, (AP)—What promises to be an interesting and profitable program has been prepared for the second annual Conference of the Trade and Commerce Journalists section of the Newspaper Conference, to be held at the University of Oregon, Friday and Saturday, February 12 and 13.

Friday morning, trade and class paper men will meet in joint session with the delegates who attend the sessions of the daily and weekly press to hear a paper by Dr. H. W. Crosby, professor of psychology, on "The Results of a Two Year Scientific Investigation of the Causes of Errors in Proof-reading." Many American Industries Have Laid off Employees

GENEVA (AP)—Figures showing the world unemployment situation, published by the International Labor Review, indicate that during September and October last no important change occurred in general unemployment conditions.

In Germany unemployment reached proportions hitherto unknown in that country. About ten per cent of the five million workers covered by the returns were reported to be without work, and nearly forty per cent of the total in work were cited as laboring on short hours.

In contrast to the experience in Germany, a decrease in unemployment has been taking place in Czechoslovakia, Austria and Poland.

The report continues: "In the United States a small contraction in employment has taken place. This decrease was shown particularly in the mining and smelting industry and in the manufacture of rubber, boots and shoes, automobile tires and agricultural implements."

SPOKANE, Wash. (AP)—From a small shipment during the Christmas holidays to a carload lot at the present time, in the way Spokane residents received the invasion of Alaska reindeer into local food centers, according to statistics issued by various dealers.

The meat is enjoying wide popularity, it was reported. Shipments are received from Nome, Alaska and arrive here packed and ready for market.

Cheap Taxis Make Money in Argentina's Capital

Buenos Aires, (AP)—An American taxi driver, who operates large fleets of taxicabs in New York and other cities, sent a dozen of his vehicles to Buenos Aires a few months ago, and has found the enterprise profitable despite the fact that taxi fares are far cheaper than in New York, and the price of gasoline is higher. The fares are reported to have made a net profit of 500 pesos each a month, or about \$275 at current exchange rates. American visitors to Buenos Aires say taxi fares are so cheap here that the people use them more, hence the profits.

Buenos Aires taximeters, regulated by municipal ordinance and inspection, are set at 50 centavos for the first 1,200 meters and thereafter register 10 cents for each additional 200 meters. This works out in American money and distances at current exchange to about 17 cents the first three-quarters of a mile and less than 4 cents for each fifth of a mile additional.

Stored Wheat is Large

PENDLETON, Ore.—Wheat produced in Umatilla county in 1923 and stored in warehouses amounting to 7,017,641 bushels, according to statistics obtained from all the warehouses in the county by Carl Halderman, district agent for Kerr, Clifford and Co. of this quantity 4,521,776 bushels, or about 65 per cent, has been shipped by the railroads to market, according to figures from the carrier companies.

The 1923 crop is a little more than one-half million bushels in excess of the warhouse figure for the 1921 crop when, according to Mr. Halderman, the warehouses received 6,455,000 bushels.

With the national production of something in excess of 500,000,000 bushels, Umatilla county has the distinction of having produced within its own confines about 1 per cent of all the wheat grown in the United States, the report indicates. Only a bushelage grown is not included in warehouse receipts because a considerable quantity is kept on ranches for seed and feed.
