LONDON, (INSB)—New and amazing results in the treatment of pneumonia are claimed for a preparation now being used at the Hospital of the Holy Ghost here.

The preparation, known as "antimicrobium-Tomarkin," is the discovery of Dr. Tomarkin, surgeon to the hospital, who claims that under his new treatment deaths through pneumonia in the Holy Ghost Hospital have been reduced to 4 per cent as against 40 per cent in other hospitals where the customary treatment was used.

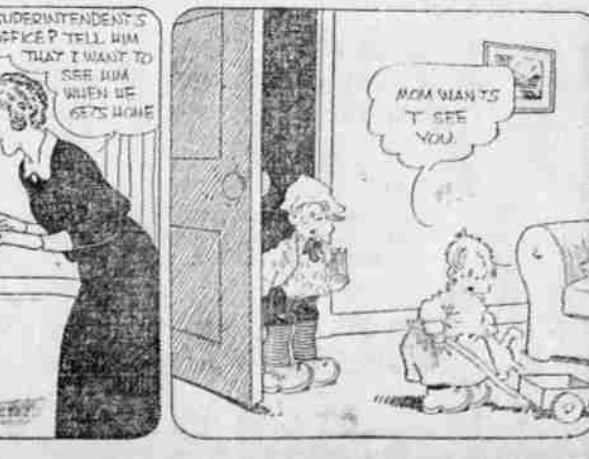
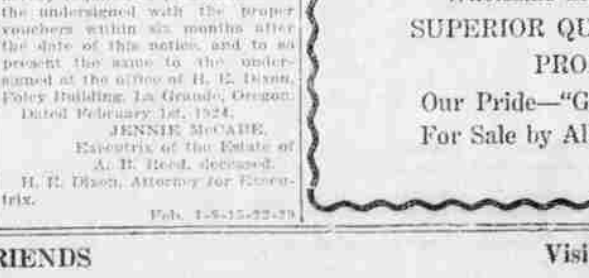

BLOOMSBURG, (AP)—A new means of ridding electric power wires of accumulations of sleet and snow has been tried out successfully by a power company operating in this section.

A scheme of changing the wires and making them hot enough to melt the ice and snow was worked out, and whenever the sleet forms on the wires managers of the company to all managers of sub-stations telling them to change the wires. Radio equipment has been installed in all the sub-stations so that the company can get all stations at once.

The faults cited by the superintendent include the following: Not punctual in opening school; close too early in the afternoon; neglect classes during the day; teach, read or write letters during school hours; permit children while on the school grounds to use obscene language and otherwise misconduct themselves; fail to solve difficult problems in upper grade arithmetic; do not prepare their lessons properly and

BAKER, Or.—Confirmation of the sale of 600,000 pounds of wool wool houses were recently in Baker county wool growers, to Koshland & Co., Boston, was received by William Poolman, prominent Baker stockman and trader. The price received by the local wool men was 40 cents a pound, with the exception of one lot that brought 42 cents.

Representatives of the Boston wool houses were recently in Baker, conferred with Mr. Poolman and local sheep men and turned in their report with the subsequent acceptance by their firm. The price received, totaling nearly \$250,000, is considered by all to be satisfactory and will pace the Baker county wool growers in excellent shape for the coming season.
