## DIRIGIBLE TO INVADE NORTH

Airship Service Will Soon Carry Miners Into the Arctic Circle.

ANCHORAGE, Alaska, (AP)—Prospectors, miners and trappers will be taken into the Arctic Circle by dirigible next summer, if a company, whose representatives here are in interior Alaska, carries out announced plans.

Those organizing the project say they believe the dirigible will prove a solution for the placer operator, who finds the long slow routes of waterways and dog trails a serious problem in time and finance. The "farthest north" trappers are confronted with the same difficulty.

The firm airship will fly, according to the announcement, between Fairbanks, the Chukchee and Koyukuk. It is planned eventually to extend the service to other districts.

If dirigible transportation is thus installed, the traveler may reach the Arctic circle within eight days after sailing from Seattle. He would travel by boat six days, landing in Anchorage, then by train 24 hours to Fairbanks, whence he would be whisked thru the air for the last and hardest lap of the journey.

With the passing of many of the famous old placer camps south of the Yukon, the prospectors have pressed over northward, into the shadow of the Polar wilderness. However, the promising fields within the Arctic Circle offer the hydraulic operations, and even where a "dry digger" has been made, it is a matter of weeks, sometimes months, to get a force of miners and the equipment over the snow and ice trails into the remote sections.

The company's representatives declare they can carry two tons of men and equipment into the Arctic in a few hours, at a cost of about one-fourth that entailed by that entailed by dog-sled transportation.

The dirigible also may be used to take summer tourists for visits to "The Arctic alps."

The announcement of the contemplated dirigible service has stirred in Alaskan towns a clamor for mail to be delivered by air to such points as Nome, the Upernivik, Kuskokwim and the Kobuk counties. At present this mail is carried by dogs and reaches from two weeks to a month after it leaves the Alaska Railroad.

The parcel post business has grown to such dimensions that it is costing the government a heavy sum to supply points that are cut off from modern transportation.

## TURKEY MAY LOSE HAREMS

The Harem Must Go or Ottomans May Face a Scarcity of Women, Is Claim.

ANGORA, (AT)—Polygamy and the harem may disappear from Turkey, if the recommendations made by the Turkish parliamentary commission are adopted by the national assembly. On the grounds of economy, and because of the growing scarcity of marriageable women, members of the commission believe that the modern Turk should be content with one wife. They believe that if each man were to avail himself of the four wives permitted by the Koran there would not be sufficient women in Turkey to make possible one wife for every man.

The commission recommends also the granting to women of the right to divorce, as well as giving for separation proceedings, instead of the present method where by the husband has only to return the wife's dowry and say Bismillah. And the wife is cast adrift.

Those principles in favor of monogamous marriages and modern divorce will be urged by deputies when the project comes before the assembly. It is certain to meet with determined opposition by peasants to whom four wives, which is the maximum number allowed by the Prophet Mohammed, may be often a source of wealth because they are all forced to work on the farm.

The modern Turk of the city finds it impossible to maintain such a harem because he has learned that Turkish women of the better class are fond of expensive dresses and pretty things. His stockings for three or four wives cost a lot of money. He has also found that if a man takes more than one wife, he must take three. Two are impossible, he says, because they quarrel all the time and the husband is bound to be unhappy; each will ask him to take her side and there will be no peace in the home.

But with three wives, it is explained, there is harmony because the wives keep their quarreling to themselves, and if one becomes too strong the other two will unite against her.

Again, it is asserted, the modern Turk of education is very hostile to the influence of religion on his forefathers. Priding himself on his western ideas and education, he is content to leave his wavering belief in the laws of the Koran to the untutored masses and the peasants.

The condition of the state highways in Eastern Oregon, according to the weekly report of the state highway commission issued through the division offices in La Grande, follows:

Ontario - Huntington - Baker - Union - La Grande - Pendleton - Emmett - Arlington - The Dalles: Macadamized entire distance and in good condition. Blue Mountains between Pendleton and La Grande kept free of snow by snow plows. To make trip without difficulty on mornings following heavy snows machines should not leave Pendleton or La Grande until about noon. Details can be secured from Highway Division office at La Grande. Chains required in Blue Mountain Section.

Old Oregon Trail-West of The Dalles

The Dalles - Hood River - Portland - Rainier - Clatskanie - Astoria - Seaside: Paved entire distance.

La Grande - Walla Walla - Highway

La Grande - Island City: Paved, Island City - Elgin - Minam - Walla Walla - Lostine - Enterprise - Joseph - Walla Walla: Laker Macadamized and in good condition.

Baker - Cortrupia Highway

Baker - Halfway: 19 miles macadam; 21 miles graded road.

Oregon - Washington Highway

Pendleton - Washington State Line: Paved.

Pendleton - Pilot Rock - Vinson

Heppner - Heppner Junction: Macadamized except between Vinson and Jones Hill where going is very rough. Traffic between Jones Hill and Vinson may be handicapped by snow and mud at this time of the year, and local inquiry should be made before attempting trip.
