would be declared in Williamson county. Adjutant General Black said: "There'll be no martial law in Williamson county."

When asked why he had issued the order calling out more troops he declined to have commit himself. Adjutant General Black declared in a statement to the Associated Press he had made a thorough survey of the situation but he had concluded himself that complete martial law would not be necessary and added that he would not call on Governor Small for such an order. When asked how long the troops would remain in Williamson county, he said he could not say whether one day or one month.

A clash between the "weeds" and "drys" Friday night precipitated the trouble which led to three killings of Constable Constable Cagle and the serious wounding of Deputy Sheriff John Layman. Sheriff Galtman was arrested on orders from Young, at Cardonville Saturday as he returned from Murphysboro, where he had taken Ford and the other two policemen. Mayor Anderson and several others who are regarded as leaders of the faction opposed to the Klan have been charged with the killing of Cagle.

After a period of three months, much testing, he then entered the law firm of Cotton and Franklin. McAdoo said he did not begin service with Doherty until November 20, 1919 and had no agreement with Doherty before he quit the cabinet.

In the course of the long examination McAdoo forcibly repeated over and over his assertion that the attack made upon him was purely political. "I conceive that the matter is wholly irrelevant to the subject matter of your inquiry," he said in conclusion. "But I have been willing to come here and give these facts for such use and for such value as they may have in the pursuit of your investigation. Greeted With Applause.

committee room with David Rockwell, of Ohio, manager of his campaign, McAdoo was greeted with a burst of applause. In his prepared statement McAdoo said that his employment with Doherty was in line with efforts to prevent the confiscation of American property in Mexican oil lands and that he believed he was doing public service in protecting the fuel supply essential to American industry.

ITALIANS ALARMED BY KU KLUX KLAN SYMBOLS

SIENA, Italy (AP).—In the town of Lugo, near Avenna, the police have made a curious discovery. The letter "K" has been found stamped on the walls in all directions. Suspicions have been aroused that it is the work of an Italian section of the Ku Klux Klan. A number of families have recently received threatening letters signed "The Grand Templar" and sealed with the letters "K. K. K." A certain shopkeeper, Sebastiani, has had a letter in which he is threatened with a grievous fate because he erased from the wall of his own house the letter "K" that had appeared there mysteriously. The city is greatly disturbed, and the police are investigating.

Argentina Makes Big Strides As Cheese-Producing Country

BUENOS AIRES, (AP) — As a producer of cheese, Argentina in the last decade has made the greatest showing of any country in the world, according to Leon Estabrook, the American agricultural expert who is temporarily serving the Argentine government.

Between 1912 and 1923, his statistics show, the country's cheese production increased 766 per cent. In 1919 Argentina was actually importing cheese, while in 1922 the output exceeded 24 million kilos, sufficient not only to supply the home demand but to permit the exportation of 6,535,998 kilos.

Lack of Funds Halts Work on Methodist Building in Havana

HAVANA, (AP).—Lack of funds has resulted in halting the completion of the \$200,000 Central Methodist college, but the work has so far advanced that activities of the church and school can go on. The institution is part of the foreign missionary work of the Methodist Episcopal church, South, and its completion is said to depend upon the success of the Tercentenary Fund being raised in the United States.

Says Rembrandt Painted Self.
THE HAGUE, (AP).—Professor Martin of Mauritshuis, the famous art gallery, has published an article in which he expresses the opinion that Rembrandt painted a portrait of himself in "The Night Watch," the celebrated picture which is the gem of the Amsterdam gallery.

Martin believes the man standing between the ensign and one of the pictures in the picture is Rembrandt, a self-portrait done in the style of his portraits from 1629 to 1642.

BLOOMSBURG, Pa. (AP).—Bloomsburg residents of homes adjoining churches declare life is just one interruption after another.

June and December are the two months with the most interruptions, and these are due to the number of young persons seeking

ministers to perform marriage ceremonies. The supposition is general that persons are located adjacent to churches, but in Bloomsburg there are only three of 15 churches where this is true, and the other pastors live a block or two from their churches. The result is the families residing next to the churches are visited by couples more.

G. Edward Elwell, whose residence adjoins the Methodist church here, received 60 calls from couples during 1923, all seeking a minister to perform a marriage ceremony. In each case they were informed that the parsonage is two blocks away.
