PEKING, (AP)—Miss Chiang Chin-yin, an 18-year-old high school girl who recently disputed the right acknowledged through thousands of generations of a parent to give his daughter's hand in marriage without her consent, has scored a noteworthy triumph. Not only has she conspired her father and mother to see modern view point, but her elder brother as well has renounced his right to a voice in the selection of his sister's life partner.

Miss Chiang made known her determination to defy parental authority by inserting an advertisement in various Chinese news papers notifying everybody interested that she refused to recognize a betrothal agreement made by her elders with the father of young Hsing Poo-chi. 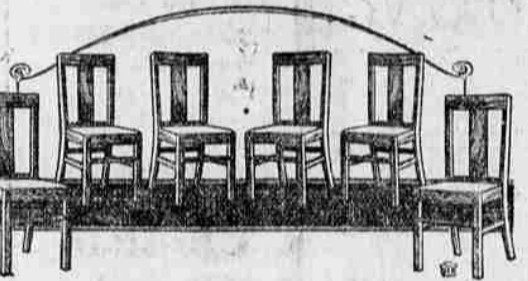

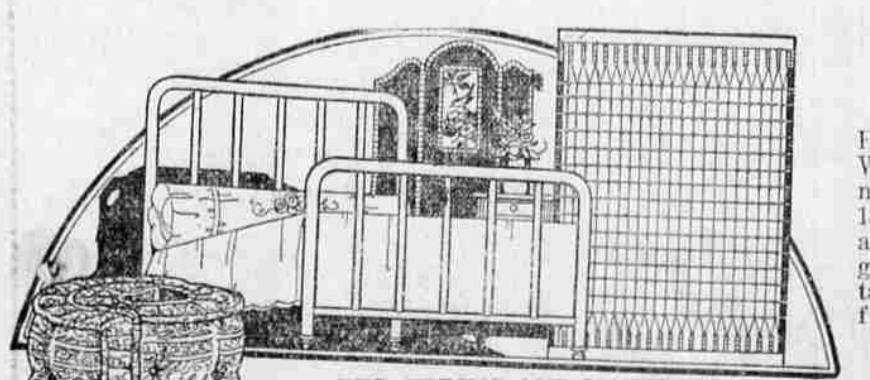

## NEW INSTRUMENT TRANSMITS 1,000 WORDS A MINUTE

LONDON, (AP)—Striking evidence of the advancement made in invention during 1923 is found in the recent exhibit of telegraphic and other instruments at the British Imperial College of Science and Technology. The most notable development is in telegraphy; delay in submarine cable has been largely eliminated by utilizing the action of light on selenium, which responds so rapidly that the signal sent out is recorded even before the full current has passed over the wire.

A magnetic telegraphic drum recorder is shown, capable of speeding up messages to 1,000 words a minute. This is effected by the current of the incoming signal passing through coils contained in a rapidly revolving iron drum and turning it into a magnet for a brief space, thus attracting a slight piece of iron, shaped like a brake shoe. This operates a fine system of relays which, with ink, causing it to record the signal on the paper tape as it flies past it.

Another exhibit is an "undulator," or an instrument used in high speed wireless telegraphy, capable of printing on an endless strip of paper up to 200 words a minute.

Another device which appealed both to laymen and professional is the complicated photographic apparatus for taking motion pictures at the rate of 5,000 a second.

## Wild Game Is Confiscated

MEDFORD, Or.—Letters from the state game warden's office in Portland have been received by a number of apartmentmen in Medford and Ashland, containing releases to be signed by them for the wild ducks and geese killed in season that they were keeping in the various cold storage places in town, as these birds were confiscated by the government.

This action was taken as the result of a state law covering all migratory birds, so that they could be kept in cold storage not later than January 15.

On January 27, Ray Steel, United States game warden, arrived in Medford and inspected all the cold storage places, and noted the names of those who had game there and has since sent them these notices of confiscation. This law is little known in the valley and is exciting some comment among apartmentmen.
