Asks Conference.
Sam Harris, whose property on
First street was recently condemned,
appeared before the commission
and asked for a conference today
with the city manager and the fire
chief of La Grande with the view
of investigating the condemnation
action. The request was granted.

Parking Question Exp.
The question of a system of con-
sidered parking for motor ve-
hicles was brought before the com-
mission and was referred to E. B.
Hayer, city manager, with instruc-
tions to ascertain the opinion of the
business men on the matter. As the
plan was proposed cars would be
parked diagonally in the center of
the streets, as is done in Pendle-
ton, and no car could stop longer
than five minutes at the curb and
even then, someone would neces-
sarily be in attendance.

Permit Granted.
A permit was granted John T.
Gilbert to secure a pop corn sales
license.

Petition Favored.
A petition was presented request-
ing the improvement of First street
from N to O avenue. The petition
was favored and an improvement
district covering this section was
ordered created. It will provide
for 30-foot pavement with gutters,
etc.

Audit Bid Accepted.
The bid of Whitcomb, Prepen-
brink and Co., of Pendleton, to au-
dit the city books for 1923 was
accepted. Two other bids were re-
jected.

Ordinances Passed.
An ordinance authorizing the
signing of contracts for the im-
provement of district No. 132 with
the Warren Construction company
was passed.

An ordinance providing the man-
ner of making an estimate for the
proposed construction, repairing or
rebuilding of the present water
delivery system in La Grande was
passed.

Henry Bellmer was given a con-
tract to furnish a team for city
work during the coming year.

Bills of the past month were pre-
sented, allowed and ordered paid
by warrant.

STANFIELD IS LOSER IN CASE AT WEISER, IDA.

WEISER, Idaho.—A verdict of
not guilty was returned by the
jury in the Hand-Bradley embe-
zzlement case, which was tried in
district court here and in which
Senator R. N. Stanfield of Oregon
was the complaining witness and
charged his former partner, M. H.
Hand, with the fraudulent appro-
priation of \$1200 from the Cotton-
wood Sheep company in August,
1921, in which the two were in-
terested. Hand's father-in-law,
George C. Bradley, was accused of
helping in the fraud.
