

# UNION READY FOR TOURNEY

Preparations for Entertainment of Basketball Teams From Six Counties Going Ahead.

UNION, Ore. (Special).—Supt. Roy Conklin and the high school teachers and students are working on the evening of the gymnasium, in preparation for the tournament of District No. 1, consisting of Union, Walla, Baker, Grant, Malheur, and Harney counties which will be held here on the last two days of this month and March 1. An extra gallery is being built and seats will be arranged around the floor in order to accommodate the fans who will be here for the games. Most of the teams from first three counties named will be here and at least one from each of the three more counties. The meet will see from ten to fifteen schools represented during the three days. Letters are being sent out to every high school in the six counties, announcing the dates and telling about the tournament. In fact everything possible is being done to interest the schools and make this first district tournament a success.

# PLATFORM IS A 'KNOCKOUT'

Candidate for Office Would Lower Prices, Raise Wages, Stop War and Jail Daugherty.

BRIDGEVILLE, Pa. (INS).—Every now and then a candidate for office comes out with a card showing a slight variation of the time word "your vote and support is respectfully solicited," but John W. Hedderich, Jr., is passing one around that is admitted to be entirely original. Hedderich's card is about three by five inches and tells everything from the pronunciation of his name to all the details of his platform. He would like to go to Congress.

On the face of the card is Hedderich's picture and the note that the name is pronounced "Hedderich." He says he is a "La Follette Progressive," was drafted and served overseas with a unit of the 80th Division. After that state in capital letters are the words—"NOT A SHAVE TAIL." Beneath his picture is the statement: "I was born the year of the BATTLE OF HOMESTEAD, when Lincoln was defeated by Capitalism."

The platform which he announces is, he says, "what you will get after you clean the tools of Big Business out of office." The platform follows in part:

5 cent sugar all the year round.  
5 cent beer same as before the war.  
7 cent gasoline, same as in California.

5 cent carfare and free transfers.  
5 cent phone calls, same as gratifying letter.  
Lower R. R. rates, higher R. R. wages.  
More pay for clerks, less profits for companies.  
No injunctions, jail for Daugherty.  
Stop immigration, keep up wages.
