FIRPO-WILLS GO TO BE ABANDONED

NEW YORK (AP)—Negotiations by which a New York syndicate headed by Lew Raymond sought to arrange a heavyweight match between Luis Angel Firpo, Argentine heavy-weight, and Harry Wills, Negro contender, next July probably will be abandoned indefinitely within a few days.

This was forecast Sunday night. It was learned that the syndicate, in the face of the present deadlock with Firpo over the place of deposit of a \$50,000 forfeit, intended to impose further conditions on the South American in event he accepted the terms.
