LEGION PLAYS UNION TONIGHT

Independent Basketball Teams to Clash on the Union Gym Floor.

COACH LEAVES, STARS QUITTING CENTRE COLLEGE

ATLANTA (INS)—Withdrawal of three Centre College basketball players, soon after the resignation of Charley Moran as coach, had started tongues wagging again in the South. Folks here are wondering if the Centre splash upon the football sea will now prove nothing more than a bubble, or if the gallant "Colonels" will be able to continue their brilliant playing.

While college officials have denied the players left school because of Moran's resignation and also deny that any more players will leave, there is considerable gossip that Covington, Leman and some of the others will follow in the wake of the first three. With the naming of a new coach soon, however, things should settle down once more in Danville.

Announcement by Georgia Tech athletic authorities that a new all-year coach would be added to the present staff of five men has been received with wide acclaim in Atlanta, where the Tornado is tied up between playing spells. The slight slump of the famous Southern eleven this last fall was attributed to the lack of coaches to handle the green players who formed the eleven.

Joe Guyon, famous halfback of the 1917 unbeaten team which was generally acclaimed national champion, is the man everyone thinks will be selected by W. A. Alexander to be the new assistant coach. Guyon coached Union college last fall and gave that institution its best team.

The influx of Eastern and mid-western collegiate nines into the South will begin soon, and Southern colleges are busily preparing

their diamonds for these engagements.

Yale, Dartmouth, Notre Dame, Ohio State and a few others are contending for this year for spring training.

Collegiate, interscholastic, and club relay teams throughout the South are busy preparing for the annual Southern Relay Games held on Grant Field, Atlanta, April 25-26. The twenty and more colleges in the Southern conference, numerous K. L. A. A. teams, a strong representation from the Southeastern A. A. U. and leading prep and high schools of the South will send teams for the big two-day meet.

CHILEAN HEAVY MAY BE MATCHED WITH DEMPEY

NEW YORK (By the Associated Press)—Jack Dempsey may be called on to defend his heavyweight championship against a new South American menace next fall, if present plans of Tex Rickard materialize.

The promoter announced Monday that he had guaranteed Quintin Romero-Rojas, Chilean heavyweight, a purse of \$100,000 for a title fight with Jack Dempsey, possibly in September, if he succeeds in disposing of three preliminary opponents. Rickard has come to a definite agreement with the Chilean and called the boxer Monday to fix the earliest possible date on which he can reach this country.

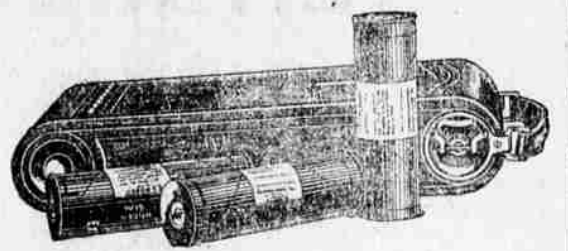
