## LOCAL BOOTH ILLUSTRATIVE

Entry of Union County in O. A. C. Educational Exhibition Is Witnessed by 8,000.

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis—(Special)—Union and La Grande combined in making up the Union county booth at the college educational exhibition. The entire county was illustrated in a miniature scene. The exhibition was well attended. More than 1000 students and faculty members attended, representing 112 high schools. More than 5000 persons in all saw the exhibition.

A tiny village on the right of the booth represented La Grande and 12 miles in the distance was Union. A miniature passenger train ran to and fro from Union, through La Grande, and out to Willows lake in the foothills. The Old Oregon trail, which is the only trans-continental trail open throughout the year, ran through La Grande. A gravel path represented the La Grande-Willows highway.

The blue mountains were formed on banks of moss. Snow of cotton lay on the foothills in the distance. Artificial pine trees stood about the county. Miniature cities, plants and a tiny pen of sheep brought life to the scene. Leaves of different grains from the county against the blue and white crepe paper formed the background of the scene.

Bags of ten kinds of grains, blue mountain butter, apples, and nutted gems potatoes were among the products representative of the county industries. Farrel Hess and Waldo Stoddard were representatives in charge of the booth. Independence won first prize, Corvallis, second prize, and Lebanon, third prize.
