Church Controversy Discussed in Report

al statements. Others, however, repudiate the thought of separation, claiming it to be the mission to purify the church from within and not to abandon it to the unrepentant and unclean.

"Moderates, on the other hand, are equally pronounced, and perhaps it may be said equally intolerant. They stand for liberty of thought without regard to ecclesiastical obligations. Their frequent claims to superior intelligence cannot always be charged with too great modesty.

"It is not the intention here to attempt adjudication or reconciliation. From the missionary standpoint our problem is to ascertain whether cleavage is necessary or avoidable, and to determine how far, in other cases, co-operative movements, developed so largely in recent years and to so great advantage, can be salvaged from the wreck."

The report then referred to two papers read on this subject at the Oxford meeting of the International Alliance last summer, one by Dr. Robert E. Speer of the Presbyterian church in the United States and the other by Dr. E. J. Palmer, Bishop of Bombay. Summarizing these papers, the report quotes passages from the New Testament to show that that part of the Bible "inculcates the spirit of tolerance and brotherly love," and adds, still referring to the address of Dr. Speer and Bishop Palmer: "These and similar scriptures are not adduced to prove that men should not contend for what they believe to be essential truth, but rather that the cultivation of his spirit would remove asperities, and make it possible to appreciate each other's viewpoint, and help in finding the truth which lies somewhere between the extremes."

Despite doctrinal differences, missionary cooperation among the denominations can accomplish, in the opinion of the ecclesiastical quoted, much in such matters as education and the stamping out of the "dope menace."

"On the other hand," continued the report, "it is easy to give instances in which doctrinal differences make cooperation impossible."

ble, such, for example, as theological education in the larger and truer sense. There is a vast error of academic teaching in the theological field, such as the history of doctrine, forms of worship, church history and organization, that are a common possession and upon which the ministry should be informed and might well be taught cooperatively. Yet in differences so great, as to the value of the sacraments—that might well make cooperation impossible.

"Finally, as to the further question, whether there is any doctrine so central as to preclude the possibility of cooperation, the answer is that all Christian missionary effort is an attempt to present Christ as the final revelation of God."

"To cooperate with any who definitely deny that Jesus is God is to abandon the central reason for which Christian missions exist."

"The missionary should remember that he himself is permitted labor in foreign fields through the toleration of people holding religious views essentially different from his own. He seeks by persuasion to lead men to recognize the supremacy of Jesus Christ. It is evident that the path to this end is not the way of alienation and judgment and expulsion, but the way of gentleness and love, the way of calm and reasonable statement of the grounds upon which we hold what appears to us to be the truth. We best help others, and best grow ourselves into fuller apprehension of truth, by keeping wide and kindly the bounds of Christian fellowship, by preserving the unity of the body in the bond of peace and by doing together as much of the work of the Kingdom of Christ as is practicable."

to na, fault of the taxpayer, no penalty attaches, but interest attaches to the amount of the deficiency at the rate of 4 per cent a year. If the understatement is due to negligence—absence of reasonable care under the circumstances—there is to be added 5 per cent of the total amount of the deficiency, together with interest on the amount of the deficiency at the rate of 12 per cent a year from the time the tax was due, or if paid on the installment basis, on the deficiency of the installment from the time the installment was due. Dr. W. T. Phy, and Professor Myelop, of the Oregon Agricultural College. The speakers urged strong support of the movement stating that concrete benefits to the community would result from such an exhibition. Prof. Myelop also stated that standardization of crops, especially "Hybrid 28" wheat and "Grimm" alfalfa, in eastern Oregon was a feasible plan for farmers to follow at the present. The chamber of commerce appointed a committee, consisting of Bruce Dennis, A. W. Nelson and Ed Holmes to meet with the Episcopal vestrymen to consider the matter.

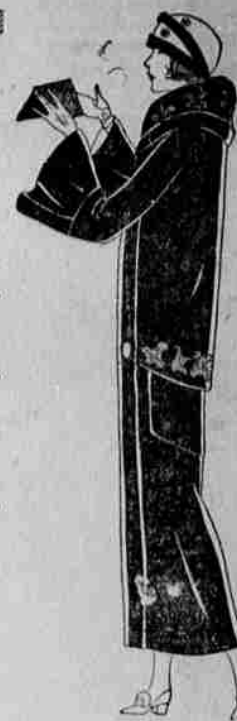
