"Whether the candidate for the presidency is 'wet' or 'dry' is my only concern," he commented on the coming elections.

He does not smoke and abhors the smell of burning tobacco. Although rabidly anti-prohibition, Maxim seldom drinks, he avers.

WATERMELONS ON SALE IN FLORIDA; 2000 ARE ON HAND

PORT MEYER, Fla.—First watermelons will be placed on sale at the South Florida Fair, Tampa, in February. It was revealed here when L. Lamereaux, an ambitious farmer, of Estero Island, appeared before the manager of the Fair Grounds and demanded a complimentary booth.

"Yes, sir, I have 1500 to 2000 watermelons now," Lamereaux said. "I am sure of them, and having from 2 to 3 more, more. I raised these melons on six acres of land. Those folks in Tampa think it can't come, but I'm going to show them."

Lamereaux owns a small farm on Estero Island, on the shore of the Gulf of Mexico, 40 miles south of this city. He started Fair Grounds authorities when he appeared and asked for a booth. To sell these melons in February, a thing heretofore unheard of in this section.

The modest farmer said his melons would be shipped to Tampa in carload lots and that later some of them will be shipped with the exhibit from his county (Lee) to display at Madison Square Garden, New York.

The melons that will be sold at the fair are known as "Flesh Green." They will average 15 to 18 pounds each, Lamereaux said, although some of them will be much heavier.
