chairman, will have an opportunity to study the growth of the dairy industry in a whole as related to the consumption. Cost of production figures for this and other Oregon counties will indicate the amount of fat which must be produced per cow and the size of herd which can be handled economically.

The most optimistic group of the conference and also the most pessimistic group will probably be included among the fruit growers. Cherry growers will dig into information reflecting on the future of that industry. They are at present optimistically planting an increased acreage in the county. Apple growers will attempt to find a way to lower production cost and prevent failure which now faces some growers. Prune growers have had a very bad season and are in much the same condition as apple growers.

"Should we increase our alfalfa acreage?" Several factors will influence this decision. Among these are the possible markets, danger of alfalfa weevil damage and the need of alfalfa as a legume to improve fertility.

The live stock committee is expected to present a conservative program as are grain and potato growers. Many of the recommendations which may be of benefit to groups as a whole will be of a negative nature. Of especial interest in the grain division will be the discussion of the farm legislation now before congress, this discussion will be under the direction of A. B. Hunter.

Specialists from the Oregon Agriculture College will be present to aid some of the groups. With one exception, however, they are not scheduled to speak. Paul V. Mark, director of extension, will discuss the need for an agricultural program for the state as a whole, and for Union County. Dr. W. T. Pfy will open the general session of the conference with an introduction of the reasons for a local conference and will urge on different farmer groups to get fully into the problems confronting the

local agriculture of Union County and will request them to prepare careful recommendations for a future program. Specialists from O. A. C. will be at the call of different groups to give information on production and marketing problems as requested.

Pfy, chairman of the conference and head of the dairying committee, says, "I honestly believe that the Economic Conference will mark the opening of a new epoch in the development of Union County and will be of more practical benefit to every branch of agriculture and business than anything we have ever done. Human, 87-year-old Civil war veteran, former politician and traveler, passed out to "the young folks" as he and Mrs. Human celebrated their 70th wedding anniversary here recently. "I did not" state whether his philosophy was a formula for longevity, happiness or what, but apparently Mr. Human and his wife, who is 85, have had their share of all these worldly attainments.

They were married in Humanville, Missouri, in 1854. The Civil war broke and passed. The dark days following that bitter struggle swept down upon the family, but through it all the Humans kept smiling. Finally they came west and settled in Spokane in 1895.

"An open all life and no family have been all of my pleasure," Mr. Human said. "I've got one little girl in California and the baby lives back east."
