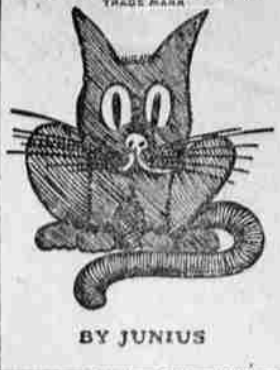
## For "Better Mailing"

With 20,000,000 letters going annually to the dead letter office and with 200,000,000 yearly requiring "directory service," the postmaster general's appeal for cooperation of chambers of commerce, boards of trade, large business and industrial concerns and the press in an intensive campaign for "better mailing," being staged now by the postal service, should meet with general response. Most of the mail that pours into the dead letter office so miscarries because of deficient address and direction. Many of those letters inclose money, more of them carry important information or call for reply. The actual injury sustained as a result of careless addressing that prevents delivery to persons intended is incalculable.

The campaign also is directed to rousing the public to realization of the cost of carelessness which, though it falls short of preventing delivery, makes it difficult. The postoffices are now called on to render much "directory service" as a result of careless addressing. While letters may finally be delivered, deficient addressing casts a heavy burden on the postal service. The time and effort consumed in perfecting addresses are paid for out of public funds.

It is in the interest of the senders, the recipients, the postal service and the public generally, the postmaster general's appeal for "better mailing" runs.

GERMANS VOICE APPROVAL FOR RETURN OF PROPERTY

BERLIN (AP)—German papers are commending the action of New Zealand in returning all plantations and industrial undertakings in German Samoa to their pre-war owners. This former German colony was given as a mandate under the Versailles treaty to New Zealand.

Under the management of Dr. Rolf, the present German ambassador to Japan, German Samoa became self-supporting, and required no help from German government after 1911. The New Zealand government retains control of public health and education in the mandate. Savaii and Upolu, each of which has an area of about 600 square miles, are the chief islands in this mandate.

JAPAN SOON TO ENJOY BROADCASTING BY RADIO

TOKIO (AP)—Radio broadcast-

ing is to be commenced next month in Japan, where hitherto communications have been strictly limited by the government. Like commercial radio, the broadcasting will be under stringent government regulations.

At first the department of communications will undertake the activity on a limited scale from stations in Tokio and Osaka only. Some months later, it is believed, the first independent station will be established here.

Receiving instruments will not be permitted to be carried about, as is often done in America, though they may be attached per-
