Swiss Dancer Has Important Part In "Duley."

Marion Davies Coming To Sherrys Sunday in "Little Old New York"

Marion Davies will have a role entirely different from anything in which she has heretofore appeared, and one exactly suited to her appealing personality when she appears as Patricia O'Day in "Little Old New York," at the Sherry theatre on Sunday, for three days. The rough, mischievous traits of Patricia, played by Miss Davies in "When Knighthood Was in Flower," are found in Little Patricia, but there is also a quality of wistful pathos which shows a new side of Miss Davies' dramatic ability.

The role of Patricia has something of the character of Maude Adams' "Peter Pan" or of "Little Lord Fauntleroy" about it. Miss Davies appears most of the time as a young boy, having donned this disguise in order to inherit a fortune.

One of the most dramatic scenes in the picture is one which gives Miss Davies a wonderful opportunity for expressing emotion in an hurried scene when Patricia's brother is buried at sea.

Conway Tearle's Work In "Ashes of Vengeance" Rewarded.
