Mr. Rollins has the art of chickens raising down to a nicety and has made a careful analysis of the requirements necessary to get real concrete results from the layers. A visit to Union is incomplete without also visiting the experimental station, managed by Robert Whytecombe, where it is possible to learn the proper care of cattle and many other important facts linked with agriculture. Here one will find the cattle segregated into numerous corrals, one lot is fed on hay exclusively, another on hay and grain and still others on ensilage and grain, etc. Their growth is carefully noted and final results tabulated so that the information may be broadcasted to cattlemen. This is only one of the many things that the experimental station does for the farmers in this locality.

Chicago grand jury's report, the judiciary committee instructed to recommend a course of procedure. An effort will be made in the house to dispose of the Atomic Shovel problem. As soon as the McKenzie bill authorizing acceptance of Henry Ford's offer for the properties is out of the way the house will get back to consideration of the annual supply bills with the deficiency and naval bills having right of way. The army bill probably will be reported during the week.

The senate will act, probably Monday, on the Norbeck-Burness bill for the relief of wheat farmers of the northwest and cotton growers of the south. Leaders have not determined what will be taken up after this measure is disposed of.

The senate finance committee will continue to work over provisions of the revenue bill in executive session while the house votes on the revenue bill in expected to decide what kind of a soldiers' bonus should be passed. Plans to bring the soldiers' bonus immediately before the house upon its report this week by the ways and means committee were announced Sunday by Chairman Green, who said he would ask for a special rule to give the measure right of way.

The finishing touches on the bill providing for paid-up life insurance policies with an option of \$50 in cash for those veterans not entitled to more than that amount will be made by a subcommittee which will start work Monday. Mr. Green said, adding he believed the draft could be reported by Wednesday. Advocates of the proposal to make full cash payments an option of the bill prepared Sunday to make a fight to have this provision written in by the house. It was lost in committee by a vote of 12 to 12.
