BULK OF HOP CROP SOLD

STALEM, Ore. — There remains unsold in Oregon approximately 2200 bales of hops, according to estimates announced by Clifford Brown, who recently completed a survey of the hop situation in this state.

The California surplus of hops has been reduced to approximately 7000 bales, Mr. Brown said, while there remains unsold in the state of Washington only 750 bales.

Purchases of 350 bales of 1923 hops was made recently by James Linn. The prices for this consignment ranged from 28 to 31 cents. Mr. Linn had intended to leave for Chicago this week, but because of the recent outbreak in the hop market had delayed his trip until some time next month.

TRAFFIC DECISIONS MADE

STALEM, Ore. — A boy or girl less than 14 years old who drives an automobile, even if he or she is accompanied by a parent, is guilty of violating the traffic laws of the state, according to a legal opinion given by the attorney general.

The question was referred to the attorney general by County commissioners, who recently presented and convicted a boy under 14 who was driving an automobile. The mother alleged he was not in charge of the car, in that she was sitting beside him and directing his movements.

The state proved, however, that the boy was at the wheel and that it was he and not his mother who actually drove the car at the time of the arrest.
