ST. PETERSBURG, Fla. (INS) Miss Rhea Crawford, the "Angel of Broadway," has met with practically the same difficulties in trying to hold revival services here as she met with in New York. But she has conducted her fight with that same winning smile that captured Broadway.

There is no law here prohibiting the holding of revival meetings but there is a fire ordinance prohibiting the covering of tents. Miss Crawford has been conducting a revival in a tent just off Central avenue.

Taking advantage of this ordinance to accomplish its aims, the local Ministerial Association met together the other day and passed a resolution requesting the commissioners to have traveling preachers conform to the same fire regulations and other regulations imposed upon the local churches.
