Grains, Wheat Supply Near 10-Year Average

per cent of the 1922 crop and 19.2 per cent of the 1921 crop so shipped; the 10-year average is 19 per cent. The proportion of the 1923 crop which is merchantable is about 89.6 per cent, against 88.2 per cent of the 1922 crop and 87.5 per cent of the 1921 crop; the 10-year average is 89.1 per cent.

The amount of wheat on farms March 1, 1924, was about 133,871,000 bushels or 17 per cent of the 1923 crop, against 155,474,993 bushels or 17.9 per cent of the 1922 crop on farms March 1, 1923, and 154,253,000 bushels or 18.5 per cent of the 1921 crop on farms March 1, 1922; the 10-year average is 18.2 per cent. About 82.4 per cent of the crop will be shipped out of the counties where grown, against 87.3 per cent of the 1922 crop and 81.7 per cent of the 1921 crop so shipped; the 10-year average is 85.1 per cent.

The amount of oats on farms March 1, 1924, was about 44,810,000 bushels or 54.2 per cent of the 1923 crop, against 42,118,999 bushels or 54.6 per cent of the 1922 crop on farms March 1, 1923, and 41,234,000 bushels or 53.2 per cent of the 1921 crop on farms March 1, 1922; the 10-year average is 57.3 per cent. About 24.7 per cent of the crop will be shipped out of the counties where grown, against 25 per cent of the 1922 crop and 23.9 per cent of the 1921 crop so shipped; the 10-year average is 25.8 per cent.

The amount of barley on farms March 1, 1924, was about 44,844,000 bushels or 22.6 per cent of the 1923 crop, against 42,469,999 bushels or 22.5 per cent of the 1922 crop on farms March 1, 1923, and 42,294,000 bushels or 27.5 per cent of the 1921 crop on farms March 1, 1922; the 10-year average is 24.4 per cent. About 24.5 per cent of the crop will be shipped out of the counties where grown, against 26.6 per cent of the 1922 crop and 26 per cent of the 1921 crop so shipped; the 10-year average is 24 per cent.

The amount of hay on farms March 1, 1924, was about 33,454,000 tons or 31.3 per cent of the 1923 crop, against 36,842,000 tons or 32.7 per cent of the 1922 crop on farms March 1, 1923, and 33,454,000 tons or 32.7 per cent of the 1921 crop on farms March 1, 1922. About 13 per cent of the crop will be shipped out of the counties where grown, against 13.7 per cent of the 1922 crop and 14 per cent of the 1921 crop so shipped.

Oregon grain crops of 1923 shipped out of the county where grown are estimated as follows: Corn, 1 per cent; wheat, 65 per cent; oats, 27 per cent; barley, 20 per cent. Of the 1922 crop there was shipped out: Corn, 1 per cent; wheat, 60 per cent; oats, 22 per cent; barley, 11 per cent. Of the 1921 crop there was shipped out: Corn, 1 per cent; wheat, 62 per cent; oats, 25 per cent; barley, 21 per cent.

It is estimated that 20 per cent of the Oregon 1923 hay crop was

AGED PETITION WANTED

BAN ON GAMBLING AND

BOOZE SOLD ON STREET

DENVER, (U.N.S.)—Swept away in a flood and rising since 1902, the minute book of the Denver city council, containing official minutes of the city for 1900 and 1901, has been discovered by a book dealer in New York, and returned to the city's archives.

An excerpt of notes of a meeting of the city council on October 8, 1900, when Denver had a population of approximately 2,000, containing a petition which reads: "To the Legislative Council of the City of Denver:

"We, the merchants doing business on Blake street, petition your honorable body to prohibit from the streets and sidewalks all gambling and selling of liquor."
