City Manager Frank Hayes today announced that a mass meeting of citizens will be held on the evening of March 17th, at 7:30 o'clock, probably in the city hall building, for the purpose of explaining and discussing various aspects of the proposed bond issue and water system.

The meeting will doubtlessly take the form of a "round table" discussion after one or more leading speakers have touched some portion of the question.

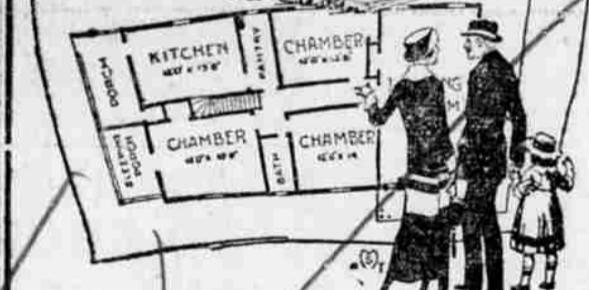
