CROSSEN MUST PAY PENALTY

and the \$250 portion of the bond naturally reverts to the city immediately.

Crossen, according to announcements last evening, had been fined \$100 only due to the fact that revoking of his license and forfeiture of his bond would necessarily result. Chief of Police Clint Haynes stated that three charges had been placed against him but two of them were dismissed under the impression that consequences following his conviction of the one, would prove sufficient penalty.

Robert Bakin, attorney for Mr. and Mrs. Crossen, appeared before the commission with a plea for leniency for his clients. However, the plea for leniency was disregarded to a certain extent due to subsequent revelations. Commissioners Black and Williams, City Manager Hayes and Police Chief Haynes all stated that Crossen's place of business had a "bad character" and that complaints that gambling had been going on had been received by each of them.

Petitions for the paving of Cedar street from Grandy to Palmer and Cedar street from Adams to Grandy were read last evening and laid over for investigation.

Toy Young applied for a license to operate a pool hall at the corner of Jefferson and Depot, and despite protests by Police Chief Haynes, his petition was granted.

A petition by A. J. Slange to build a retaining wall to the sidewalk at his property facing Walnut and Spring streets was denied.

Reports of two boxing matches were read and an investigation was authorized.

Indications, from verbal discussions, are that a petition calling for improvement by paving in the vicinity of Willow street will be denied due to some signatures on same belonging to people living outside the city limits.

Protests were heard by the commission relative to circumstances surrounding the quarantining of E. J. Jordan and Frank Soward. No action was taken but it is believed that the health officer will be asked to testify as to the above cases next Wednesday evening at commission meeting.

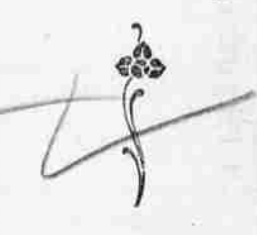
