Roasting Process Is Aid to Coffee, Cocoa

HAMBURG, (AP)—German and Swiss scientists who have been in-

vestigating the effect of coffee, tea and cocoa on the human system have reached the conclusion that coffee and cocoa are stimulating chiefly because of the chemical changes brought about by roasting. Experiments were made upon both men and dogs to discover the effects of the three drinks which are commonly used throughout the world. These showed that tea was less exhilarating than coffee and cocoa.

Coffee from which the caffeine had been extracted also was tested, and men who had used this beverage without knowing the change made in it underwent the same stimulation enjoyed by those drinking ordinary coffee. They did not, however, have the increase in blood pressure which came to those who drank coffee from which the caffeine had not been extracted.

It was the conclusion of the investigators that the roasting of coffee and cocoa change them in such a manner that when used in drinks they cause a secretion of acidity in the stomach which has a refreshing effect and increases the power for mental effort.

MOON TO SHUT OUT BIG STAR

COVE. (Special)—The occultation of Aldebaran, a first magnitude star, which will take place in the early morning of Sunday, March 16, at 4:15 o'clock is worthy of special mention. The moon occults or hides from view many stars in its journeyings but as they are so far away as to be invisible small attention is paid to them, but when a star of the size and beauty of Aldebaran is eclipsed by the moon, Cove becomes interested.

Aldebaran is 23,000 times larger than the sun and so far away that light from it takes fifty years to reach the earth, traveling at the rate of 186,000 miles per second. This star is the principal one in the constellation of Taurus, and is found in the western sky in the early evening at this season of the year and is one of the most brilliant in the heavens on account of the two celebrated star clusters, the Hyades and the Pleiades. The Hyades adorn the head of the huge charging bull, who threatens Orion with his long horns, while the Pleiades hangs on his shoulder. Aldebaran, a first magnitude star is of extraordinary beauty on account of the pale rose tint perceptible in its light. It is situated in the right eye of the bull at the top of the eastern arm of the capital letter V which is plainly marked out by the stars forming the group called the Hyades. This group is one of the most striking figures in the starry heavens.

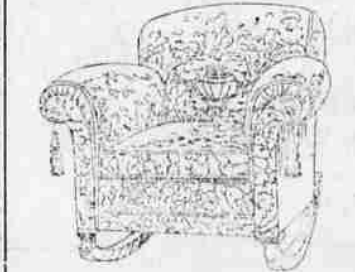

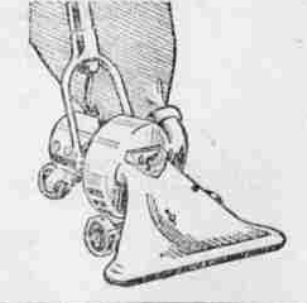

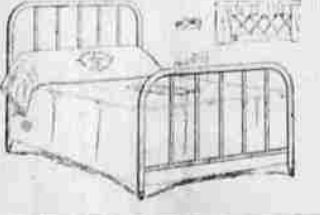
