## Baker Enters Race

The latest development in Oregon's senatorial cam-  
paign is the entrance of Mayor George Baker of Port-  
land. There was good reason to believe Baker was coming,  
but his entrance was delayed to a point when a great  
many had thought he might have given up the under-  
taking.

Choosing Salem as his place to fire his first gun may  
not seem entirely ethical, for that city is the home of Sen-  
ator McNary, who is seeking re-election, but ethics have  
about vanished in politics anyway so it makes little dif-  
ference.

Baker's speech was a very good one, for George is a  
good speech maker. His statements regarding Oregon's  
failure of recognition in Washington in years gone by is  
too true to need verification. The state line between Ore-  
gon and Idaho plainly tells the story of the way two states  
have been treated. On one side of that state line irri-  
gation by the government is everywhere, while on the  
Oregon side wide wastes of sagebrush exist today.  
It was often commented on by men traveling west when  
crossing the Snake river and noticing the different con-  
ditions, "Here's where Borah quits and Chamberlain be-  
gins." That was across Chamberlain and Bourne repre-  
sented Oregon. But for some reason little change has been  
wrought since those days. Oregon is still sucking that  
teat which is located in the rear so far as governmental  
affairs go, and yet this state has done much for the  
reclamation fund.

Well, the above is a matter of common knowledge. The  
question is, do the people want a change in their sena-  
tors, and do they want Baker or Kubli in case the people  
are through with McNary.

If it should come to a speech making campaign between  
the three candidates Baker has the thing in his pocket  
for he can make a good speech and he drives home his  
points with remarkable energy. Kubli has depended thus  
far on a pussy-foot campaign which it is whispered has  
been undone by Baker soon after Kubli's tracks were left  
in the snow.

McNary is staying in Washington, which may or may  
not be dangerous. It was dangerous to Jonathan Bourne  
when that individual remained in Washington and told  
Oregon people they were on trial and not him. It may  
result similarly to McNary, and again the people may have  
a different view of things these days.

Anyway, as it is all simmered down there are three  
candidates in the field, McNary, Baker and Kubli. The  
fight is on in earnest and to try and offset McNary's  
incumbency of the office comes a flock of Portland busi-  
ness people who are writing letters for George and ex-  
pressing a willingness to campaign the state for him.
