Reverend William Crosby Ross of the First Presbyterian church has been appointed as Miss Nash's successor. He is at present taking Coach MacTavish's place while he is in Salem.

HORCK FACING ASSAULT CHARGE AT ENTERPRISE

ENTERPRISE, Ore. (Special)—Jack Horck, Jr., was arrested Tuesday on a charge of assault and battery; the complaint being filed against him by Claude Simmons on Friday, March 7. Horck elected to stand trial and was released on a \$50 bond.

Simmons, who drives for Raars & Goldiron, alleges that he picked up two passengers in Enterprise that Horck had been counting on having and that this made Horck "nervous." He further states that Horck left Enterprise before he did and waited for him at the top of the hill this side of Loatine, pulling his stage across the highway and blocking the road.

Simmons says that as soon as he drove up and stopped, Horck ran up to the car and tried to pull him out, at the same time choking him. Simmons states that he did not have time to put on the emergency brake and was holding the car simply with the foot brake. As soon as Horck grabbed him, he says, he naturally released the brake and the car started rolling down the hill.

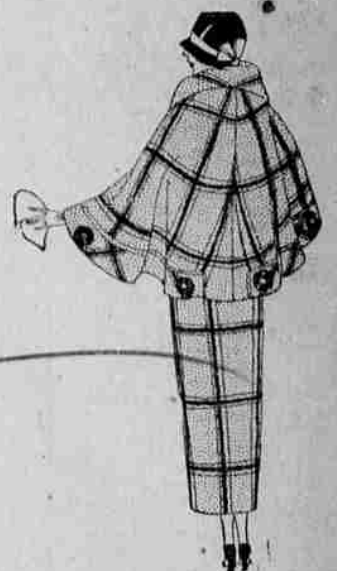
