Dallas Jacobson, who has been in Salem at the basketball tournament, returned this morning on No. 24 with the team.

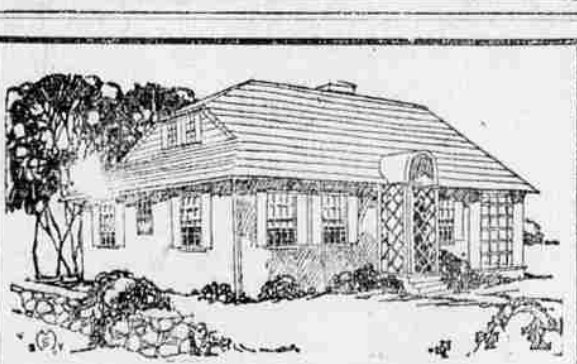
Jack Peare and William Peare, who have been attending a Knights of Columbus initiation at Heppner, returned to La Grande this morning.
