California Decided to Start Planting Cotton

MERCED, Cal. (AP)—Central California has joined the extreme southern part of the state in bidding for cotton production. Cotton is becoming a major crop in the San Joaquin valley, which stretches for more than 250 miles east and south of San Francisco.

During 1924, it was announced here during the recent visit of W. H. Camp of the United States de-

partment of agriculture, more than 50,000 acres will be planted to cotton in this section. Land in the San Joaquin valley, he said, produces an average of a bale of cotton for each acre planted. In 1923, 10,000 acres were planted in Kern county, producing 12,000 bales.

The hot weevil, which is reducing cotton production in many sections of the country, does not thrive in the irrigated sections of the San Joaquin valley, according to local experts, and the quality of the cotton is declared to be above the average.

FOR MORGAN, Colo. (INS)—A novel method of "spreading the gospel" was revealed here when E. M. Tammam, Morgan county farmer, found a mottled duck bearing a tag inscribed with Scriptural verse and carrying a post office box in Amesville, Ont.

An exchange of correspondence between Tammam and Jack Miner of Kingsville, has disclosed a dramatic story of a man's love for wild fowl, and his unusual means of preaching the gospel through tags on his feathered friends, as they fly annually from their summer home in Canada south to the warmer clime.

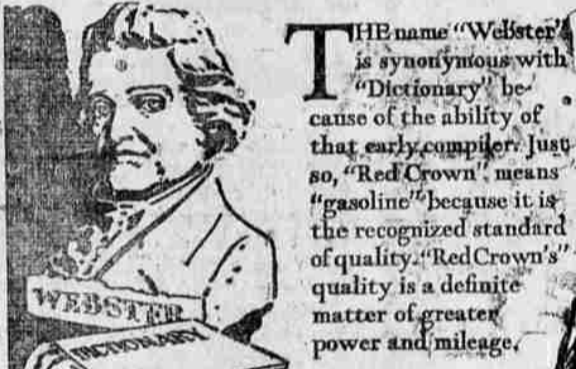

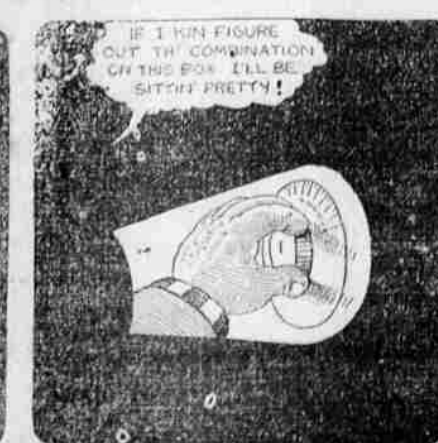
