THICK CREAM IS HELD BENEFICIAL

The advantages of thick cream are mutual to the farmer and the manufacturer," said H. D. Chappell, professor of dairy manufacturing. "Cream separation if properly operated will skim thick cream as efficiently as they will cream with a smaller amount of butter-fat."

Thick cream has a lower percentage of milk serum than thin cream and because of this does not spoil as quickly. This may be taken advantage of by the farmer who can not bring his cream to the creamery very often. According to Professor Chappell proper skimming of the cream is not objectionable, but when it is soured at random undesirable odors and over ripening may occur resulting in poor quality butter.

Dan Kelley, Charles Paddock and Howard Drew Jointly Share 100 Yard Dash Mark.

EGGERS, Ore. (AP)—Numerous Pacific coast athletic records established by University of Oregon still remain impervious to time, according to figures compiled here. Five coast marks are held alone or jointly by track men of this state. Dan Kelly still holds the broad jump mark of 24 feet 3 1/2 inches.
