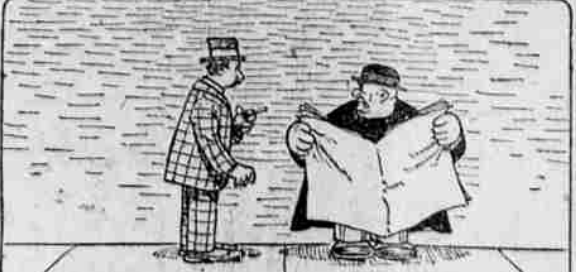

## BELIEF IS HELD THAT MAN HAS A SUICIDE RIGHT

LONDON, (INS) - Is there a right to die?

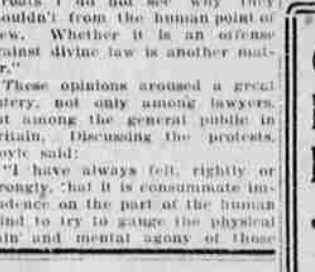
The joint has been raised again in England by George E. Royle, the coroner for the Scarborough district of Yorkshire. At a recent inquest he said:

"So far as human law is concerned, people have a right to commit suicide. I object to their being charged with attempting to do so."

"If people want to cut their throats I do not see why they shouldn't from the human point of view. Whether it is an offense against divine law is another matter."

These opinions aroused a great outcry, not only among lawyers, but among the general public in Britain. Discussing the protests, Royle said:

"I have always felt, rightly or wrongly, that it is consummate impudence on the part of the human mind to try to gauge the physical pain and mental agony of those
