NEW YORK (AP)—Joe Goldstein won the world's bantamweight championship Friday night from Joe Lynch in a six-round battle at Madison Square Garden. Goldstein gained the judges' verdict after a desperately whipping but brief all-out war in a title match between two young New Yorkers. Lynch was distinguished after one of the best exhibitions a titleholder has given in a metropolitan ring in years. He fought a straight, barbed battle from start to finish. He was a mark for Goldstein's repetitive left jab, and was rocked repeatedly by the challenger's south right across to the ribs and chin.

8200,000 Whiskey Deal Laid Bare By New York Druggist

WASHINGTON (AP)—A two hundred thousand dollar whiskey deal—the biggest yet—was unmasked Friday by the Daugherty investigating committee. John Goran, vice president of the Alpo Drug company, told a story of how he, the late Jesse W. Smith, former and friend of Attorney General Daugherty, and Howard H. Manning, one of the occupants of the "little green house on K street," had, he said, shared in the "split" which accompanied the withdrawal of whiskey from federal warehouses for sale to bootleggers.
