waters of Catherine creek that has for many years been regarded as an asset of the city of Union. A step in that direction that week occurred in the letting of a contract by A. N. Stodahl, representing the Blue Mountain Lumber company, to the Jacobs and Hess Lumber company, for 500,000 feet, or the entire cut of fir and tamarack of their Bad Mill 11 p. m. at Silverthorn-Wright's Family Drug Store. 3-21-17
