GRIDIRON CODE REVISION MADE

Four Radical Changes Agreed Upon by National Intercollegiate Committee.

NEW YORK (By the Associated Press)—Four radical changes in the football playing code, all intended to speed up the game and increase its veracity, were adopted Saturday by the national intercollegiate football rules committee at its annual meeting.

The abolition of all hand or artificial kicking tests, the advancement of the kick off from the 40 yard line to the center of the field, an increase of from 2 to 5 yards in the penalty for excess time out and decision to try for point after touchdown from the three instead of the five yard line were the most important measures approved.

Despite a recommendation by the coaches' association that the rule against the flying tackle be abolished on the ground that it is admittedly seldom enforced, the committee, after a lengthy debate, decided not to do so.

It was understood members felt that if bars were let down in this respect it might encourage fouling play.

Kicking Tests Abolished

Elimination of all kicking tests was adopted to place a greater premium on this feature, while the advancement of the kick-off from 40 yards to the center of the field was described as a natural consequence of the former rule.

A more radical change than the one adopted in connection with the try for point was suggested but pigeon-holed for a year to test whether the new rule would accomplish the desire to put greater pressure on use of a forward pass or line play than on a drop or pass kick.

Proponents of the tumbled plan would give two points for a goal from forward pass or run and only one extra point for a goal from kick. It was believed that this probably would be adopted in 1925 or the change enacted does not secure the remedy desired.

The rule to guard against interference with the forward pass by a ineligible player on the offending team was clarified to read:

"If an ineligible man on the attacking team touches a forward pass he has gained instead of claiming the penalty for illegal interference in an endeavor to keep it from being intercepted, but it is recovery by the defense before it touches the ground, the player catching the ball may run with it and retain whatever ground he gains by the ineligible player."

WOMEN TO BE 'STUMPED' NOW

Fairer Sex Will Speak for Both Parties in the Kentucky Political Campaign.

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP)—No less than 22 Kentucky women, 12 Republicans and nine Democrats, will take the stump in support of their political views during the presidential campaign this year.

Some of the widely known women are Mrs. Christine Bradley of South of Frankfort, daughter of late Senator Bradley, and a member of the Republican national committee; Mrs. Laura Clay, of Lexington, a pioneer in the women's suffrage movement whose tenacity has strongly demoralized Mrs. Alvin T. Root, widow of "Frodo" Root, for years Republican national committeewoman from Kentucky, and Mrs. J. Campbell Cantrell, widow of the Democratic nominee for governor last year who died after being nominated.

The Republican state convention only instructed the delegation to the National convention to vote for President Coolidge for president but also instructed that the vote for vice-president be cast for United States Senator Richard D. Egan, of Covington.

candidate has been mentioned among the Democrats William G. McAdoo. The Democratic state convention, which will meet in May will decide upon Kentucky's choice at the National Convention.

Kentucky this year will elect its congressman from each of the 11 districts and a United States senator. Congressional incumbents, nine Democrats and two Republicans, are understood to be candidates for re-nomination. United States Senator A. O. Stanley, Democrat, is believed to be certain to seek the Democratic nomination to succeed himself, while Judge J. H. Behrman, of Lexington, has announced he will seek the Republican nomination.

Senator Stanley faces opposition for the Democratic nomination as John J. Hoove, commonwealth's attorney for the fifteenth judicial district, has announced his candidacy, subject to the action of the statewide primary August 2.

French Flyers to Complete PARIS (AP)—An aviation tournament for commercial airplanes will be held from August 17 to 24 and will be open to contractors and firms of French nationality only. Prizes amounting to 225,000 francs will be distributed.

Planes entered must be fitted with more than one motor, carry a crew of three, sufficient fuel for 200 kilometers, electrical and radio equipment and ballast representing a minimum of six passengers each transporting a bag weighing 25 pounds.
