LUMBER TRADE CLASSIFIED FAIR
Unsettled weather still restricts trade in lumber, but it is nevertheless characterized as fair, and the market retains its strength, says the American Lumberman, Chicago. The only weak point at this time is Douglas fir, all others holding their own.
The continued firmness of the market as a whole is due to substantial stocks. Dry hardwoods are particularly scarce and command premiums. Hardwood manufacturers do not expect any great supply of their product to become available next summer, as the last several months' unfavorable producing conditions in the south, and the steady movement of green lumber into consumption, have greatly reduced the amount of new stock that has gone on sticks.
Southern pine mills are showing no eagerness for business, their order files still being sufficient to keep shipping departments busy for three weeks, with a fair volume of new business constantly coming in. They expect trade to develop rapidly as soon as the weather becomes more favorable for outdoor work, and prefer to pile any surplus production rather than make concessions.
The Douglas fir market is quiet, and market students see no prospects of any marked improvement for another thirty to sixty days. Coast mills meanwhile are curtailing production. Their stocks are estimated still to be 30 per cent below normal, so the expectation is that prices will quickly recover as full demand develops.
