GIBBONS WILL FIGHT JULY 4

Georges Carpentier Is to Meet American at Michigan City or Benton Harbor.

CHICAGO, (AP)—Tommy Gibbons of Pitt, challenger for the world's heavyweight championship and Georges Carpentier, idol of France, Tuesday night agreed to meet in a ten round no decision contest either at Michigan City, Indiana, or at Benton Harbor, Michigan, on July 4.

Carpentier was guaranteed \$75,000 with a privilege of 25 per cent of the receipts while Gibbons was guaranteed \$100,000. The fight will be presented by the Famous Circuit, representing the French light heavyweight received a certified check for \$12,000 guaranteeing the match. 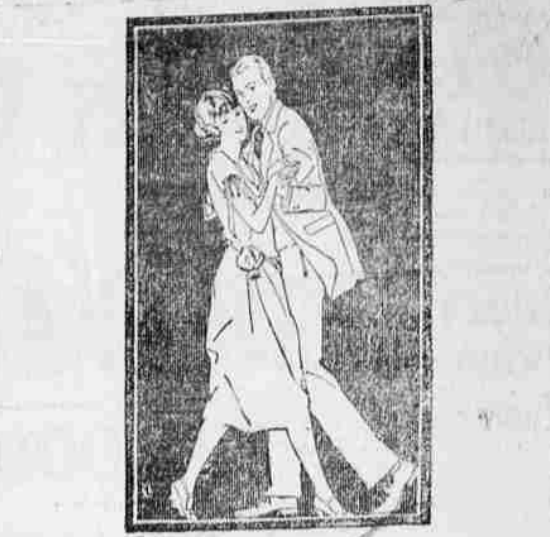
