Japan Will Make Targets of Condemned Battleships

TOKYO, CAP.—Hulls of the battleships condemned in consequence of the Washington naval treaty will be used as targets for target practice. The old battleship *Des Moines* will be a target in April for a new torpedo bomber recently completed by the navy. Two thousand pound bombs will be used.

A few weeks later the battleships *Albatross* and *Boatman*, on which the first stages of scrapping have been completed, will be used to test the effectiveness of the 16-inch guns of the superdreadnoughts *Nagato* and *Mutsu*.
