GERMANY TURNS BACK TO OLD TIME CASTLES

COVINGTON, La., (AP)—One of the famous old castles of Germany, that of the Hapsburgs, which family has been restored inside and out to the design which prevailed in 1836, and the owners believe that they have measurably added to the value and picturesque quality of the building.

The idea has been to restore the original condition and appearance of this medieval castle, and the work has been going on for some 15 years. At one time it was considered desirable to modernize old chateaux, thus in part taking away their picture-like adornment of the landscape, but the younger generation has evidenced a reaction from this procedure, and today the popular thing in Germany is the restoration of the historic dwelling to its old time beauty.
