the grandstand. He remained young in thought and in ac-

talk with Judge Crawford, and many is the father who

by taking the advice of this grand old gentleman.

Providence was good to him. He remained on earth
longer than most men and kept active in the affairs of
his fellowmen until the last.

occasion when we have talked from the same platform, each
advocating distinctly opposite views. But the personal side
never entered into the discussion. And he treated all men
the same way.

He might have seen fit to fight in the most tenacious
manner on some question that arose, but he never let that

men—but it will be a long time before the affairs of La
Grande and the state of Oregon will proceed in regular
manner without feeling the loss of this kind old gentleman

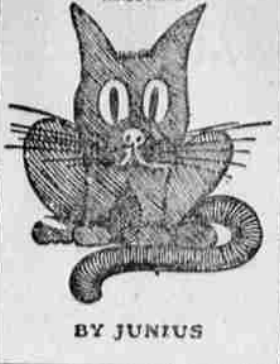

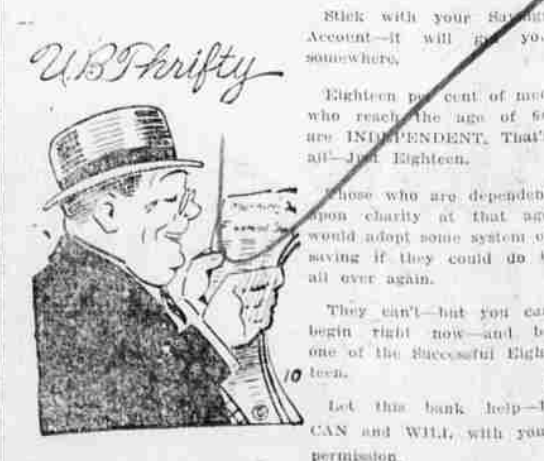

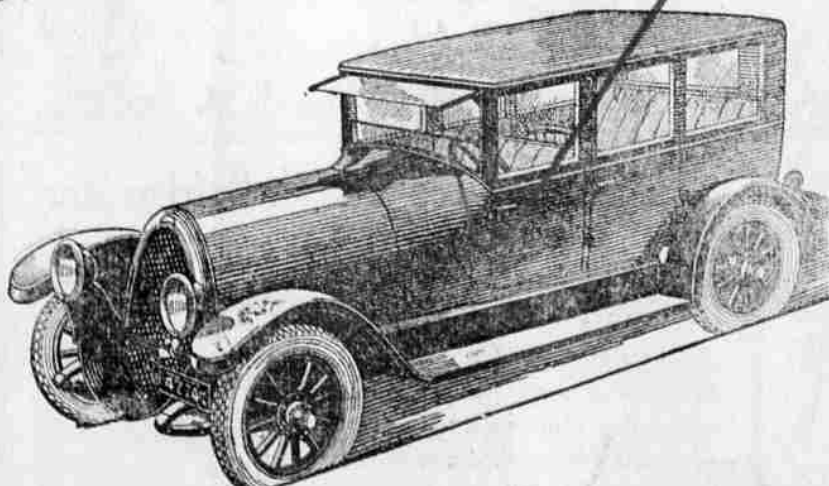
