

BOND ISSUE IS FLOATED

Farmers State Bank of North Powder Purchased \$5,000 Gymnasium Bonds at Par.

NORTH POWDER. (Special).—The recent bond issue of \$5,000 voted by the patrons of the North Powder district for a gymnasium was sold to the Farmers State Bank as it was the highest bidder. The bonds were sold at par. There was other bids but this was the highest and was accepted. The bonds bear interest at 5 per cent and will mature in twenty years. It is reported that J. W. Baxter who has charge of the manual training at Union will bid on the construction of the new building. He built the gym at Union with the aid of his manual training class and says that he can nearly duplicate it here for \$5,000. Bids are now being advertised for the construction of the building.
