U. S. Is at High Mark

Navy increased from \$402,352,900
to \$1,442,992,900, or 259.4 per cent.
That of privately owned water-
works from \$229,000,000 to \$259,
885,000, or 13.1 per cent, and that
of gold and silver coin and bullion
from \$2,019,842,000 to \$4,278,350,
or 112.3 per cent. These three
items have not been distributed to
states, but appear only in the to-
tals for the United States.

In making these estimates the
department followed in general the
methods employed in making the
estimates for 1912, though it is be-
lieved that in some respects the
work in 1922 has been more thor-
ough. It should be borne in mind
that the increases in money value
are in a large extent due to the
rise in prices which has taken
