PENDLETON TO STAGE SHOOT

PENDLETON, Ore. (Special)—There will be at least 200 trapshooters in Pendleton for the state championship shoot to be held here May 9, 10 and 11, in the opening of Guy Mattick, secretary-treasurer of the Oregon Trapshooters' association, who with Henry Collins has returned from Portland where they attended the Iron City shoot.

In addition to the state shoot here, Pendleton will on September 17, the day before the opening of the 1924 Round-Up, entertain shooters who will compete in the finals of what will be known as the Big Six shoot. Prior to the shoot here, trapshooters will compete at Portland, Tacoma, Seattle, Spokane and Walla Walla, in a series of shoots. Championships will be decided here and the shoot will attract about 500 sportsmen, it is estimated. The competition here will be called the "Round-Up, One Hundred."

There will be about 50 Portland shooters here for the May 9-11. It is estimated, according to Mattick, that the "Big Six" shoot will be Frank Trach who has to compete in the Olympic games, Jess Trach, Walter R. Hopewell, Dr. V. C. Cathey and others.
