Notice is hereby given to all concerned that there has been duly called by the Commission of the City of La Grande, Union County, Oregon, and will be held in the City of La Grande, on Thursday, the 1st day of May, 1924, a special election by the legal voters of said City, at which election there will be submitted to such voters to be voted upon by them the following questions, to-wit:

"Should the Commission of the City of La Grande be authorized to issue and negotiate negotiable coupon bonds of the City in the sum of \$50,000.00, to bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, to be paid principal and interest, in United States Gold, coin at the City of La Grande, Oregon, or at the fiscal agency of the City of Oregon in New York City, to run for a period of twenty years from date to be redeemed and paid at any time after ten years, at the option of the City, to be issued in denominations of one hundred dollars each, or any multiple thereof, up to one thousand dollars each, for the purpose of obtaining the requisite funds with which to acquire well site, drill down well, acquire and sink casing therein, and for acquiring site of water and water rights of and from Sanderson Springs near Summerdale, Oregon, for the purpose of enlarging and adding to the present water supply of the City of La Grande, Oregon, in accordance with the estimate filed with the Recorder of the City on the 28th day of April, 1924, by the City Engineer."

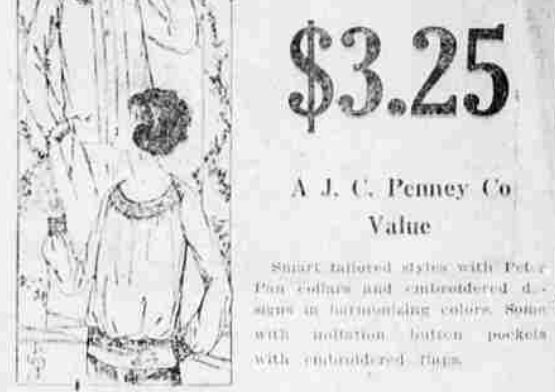
