### JERSEY ISLAND WOMEN WIN POLITICAL FIGHT

ST. HELIER (INS)—Women in the island of Jersey have won a political victory.  
After a heated debate the Jersey states have decided, by 30 votes to 12, to extend woman's political rights. They are now to be permitted to take their seats in the house as people's representatives, subject to their being 20 years of age and otherwise enjoying full civil rights.  
They are not eligible as life members. The female population of Jersey is 27,354. At the last election nominations papers handed in on their behalf were refused.
