by poisonous gases that filled the workrooms. Two miners were alive when found but died a few minutes later.

Only a faint home was held out by officials of the mine rescue car. Holmes for the other 108 men at the mine at the time of the explosion. If any of them escaped being killed outright and had time to barricade themselves in rooms filled with fresh air, some of the trapped miners may be found alive, they declared. Upon that possibility rescue crews in short shifts worked frantically throughout the day and night but had not reached the scene of the explosion Monday night.

The only victim whose body has been identified was that of J. T. Poole, the fire boss. His bullet hole at the mouth of the mine indicated he had inspected the mine and pronounced it safe before the daylight shift went to work. The explosion occurred a short time after the day shift entered the mine.

Temporary Morgue Established—A temporary morgue has been established at the mouth of the mine at Benwood to care for the bodies when they are brought out. Physicians and nurses stand ready to render assistance to any who are alive.

The explosion occurred about three miles back from the dirt road leading to the mine. Several of the men, women and children soon gathered on a slope facing the mine. They stood in a dramatic circle, pointing out the rescuers digging frantically at the mass of rock which blocked the way into the mine.

Two men found at the foot of the air shaft died before they could be brought to the surface. Their bodies, badly charred, were found in a mine motor, 2500 feet from the entry.

The rescue crew of the United States bureau of mines made a hasty inspection of the workings and expressed the opinion that few, if any, of the miners would be brought out alive. Those who escaped the explosion and fire probably fell victims of the deadly gases, they declared.

naire calling the special election was also approved and adopted.

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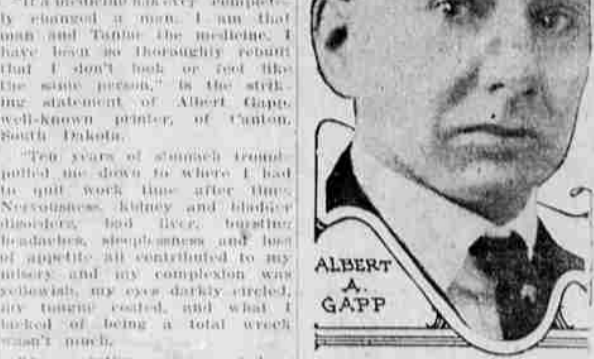
