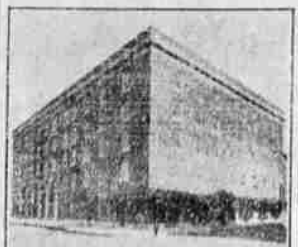

"Shall the Commission of the City of La Grande be authorized to issue and negotiate negotiable coupon bonds of the City in the amount of \$250,000 to be used in interest at the rate of five per cent per annum to be paid, principal and interest in United States Gold Coin at the City of La Grande, Oregon, or at the fiscal agency of the State of Oregon in New York City, to run for a period of twenty years from date, to be redeemed and paid in any time after ten years, at the option of the City, to be issued in denominations of one hundred dollars each, or any multiple thereof up to one thousand dollars each for the purpose of obtaining the requisite funds with which to acquire and construct thereon, and for acquiring site of water and water rights of and from Sandpoint Springs near Sandpoint, Oregon for the purpose of conveying and adding to the present water supply of the City of La Grande, Oregon, in accordance with the conditions filed with the Recorder of the City on the 9th day of April, 1924, by the City Engineer."
