Syracuse Meet Will Attract Many Stars

SYRACUSE (INS)—An interscholastic track meet, which will bring together the cream of New York state track and field athletes will be held at Syracuse university May 17, under the direction of Coach Tom Keane. This meet will include the various field events, relay races, distances and sprint races and hurdles.

Among the leading athletes who will compete are Adrian Buckner, Technical high school, Buffalo, present champion of the 100 yard dash; Frank Hussey, Syracuse high school (New York city) high school, who has equaled the time of Charles Paddock, world's fastest sprinter; John Gardner and Alfred Schillo; Hutchinson Central high school of Buffalo, star miler, the former being the present one-mile state champion and the latter being a member of the National Scholastic cross-country championship team; Clifford Arini and Ross Maari, the former of whom equaled the world's sixty-yard sprint record at the Toronto fair, and the latter defeated the Orange track team entries in the National Junior and Niagara championships, recently held in Buffalo and was third place winner in the National 1000 yard Senior championship; and Alfred Cooley, present scholastic sprint champion, who will represent Nicholas Prep school of Buffalo.
