With "Lefty" Hartman, former coast league pitcher, starting on the mound for Pasco here Sunday the Hillbreakers are expected to give the La Grande Pirates some real opposition. Pasco has won one game and lost one to Pendleton so far this year. Next Sunday will make their first appearance on this side of the mountains and their first game with La Grande so fans are looking forward to a close game. It is quite likely that the battle will resolve into a pitching duel between Hartman and Bench who will start in the box for La Grande.

Hill and Mrs. Charles DeForest, All sorts of appliances and devices to make the work in the home easier and swifter, beautiful furniture displays, suggestions and ideas relative to making the home more attractive with an inviting atmosphere over all in the impression one gets on stepping inside the doors of the Y. M. C. A. building into the Better Homes exhibition.

To the left of the main entrance one finds the cozy nook utilized by Carter's furniture store and the N. K. West company for a joint exhibition of stuffed furniture, draperies and curtains. Next to it in the corner of the room with a gaily decorated lattice overhead stands a desk with books and signs urging the visitor to use the library to help in planning or beautifying the home.

Into the next room, through a French door one steps into what seems to be a tastefully furnished library with a photograph, easy chairs and all the other accessories which make a room seem homelike but upon looking a little closer one discovers that it is in the way of a bookcase display.

Overhead near the ceiling a sign bears the one word, "White" and directly below it are the famous sewing machines by that name. "Next door" the ladies of the St. Peter's Episcopal Guild are taking orders for their cook book which was compiled and edited by the local members of the guild.

Across the hall is given over to the appliances to ease the housewife's work about the house with washing machines, mangles, irons and other devices. The H. & E. Electric company, Heacock Radio company, Skala Hardware company, Oregon Hardware & Improvement company and the La Grande Electric company all have exhibits in this section of the building.

Down the hall on the way to the gymnasium stand several washing machines on display by Nate Zweifel.

Next the office with an entire room at its disposal the Eastern Oregon Light & Power company is displaying a number of electrical machines for the household. Incidentally the E. O. L. & P. company helped make the exhibition possible by donating all the power.

Donohue's Furniture Store shares one room to the left of the hall and Richardson's Art shop has a very attractive exhibition of all sorts of home furnishings such as china, pictures and similar objects in the next room.

On the main floor of the old gymnasium the stage has been constructed. The piano used on the stage was donated by the Eastern Oregon Music company which also has a player reproducing piano and a photograph on display in the same room.

TAX ORATORY HALTS BILL

Talk in Senate Runs Unchecked; Night Sessions Threatened by Smoot.

WASHINGTON (AP)—The tax reduction bill was suspended in the senate Thursday on a vote of 60 to 35. The measure would be taken up again on Friday.

Pointing out that almost all of the vital provisions of the bill were yet to be acted upon Senator Borah called attention also that a conference on the measure would be necessary to adjust difficulties between the house and senate. This alone would require two weeks, he predicted.

Rebate carried into the approaching fiscal year on normal and surtax rates, and while Senator Borah, Democrat, Maryland, openly left the democratic ranks to support the Mellon surtax rates, Chairman Smoot concluded that there were "probably not enough votes" to gain adoption of his schedule, to gain adoption of the bill by the finance committee.

In this regard Senator Smoot denied he would negotiate for a compromise on the Mellon surtax rates within the republican party, but said he might offer compromise amendments on the floor if the treasury rates were turned down, to make the maximum surtax 22 per cent. Beyond this point, he declared, he would not go.

Senator Bruce said he was ready to cut the present maximum surtax rate of 50 per cent to 25 per cent as recommended by Secretary Mellon, or 30 to 20 or 15 per cent.
