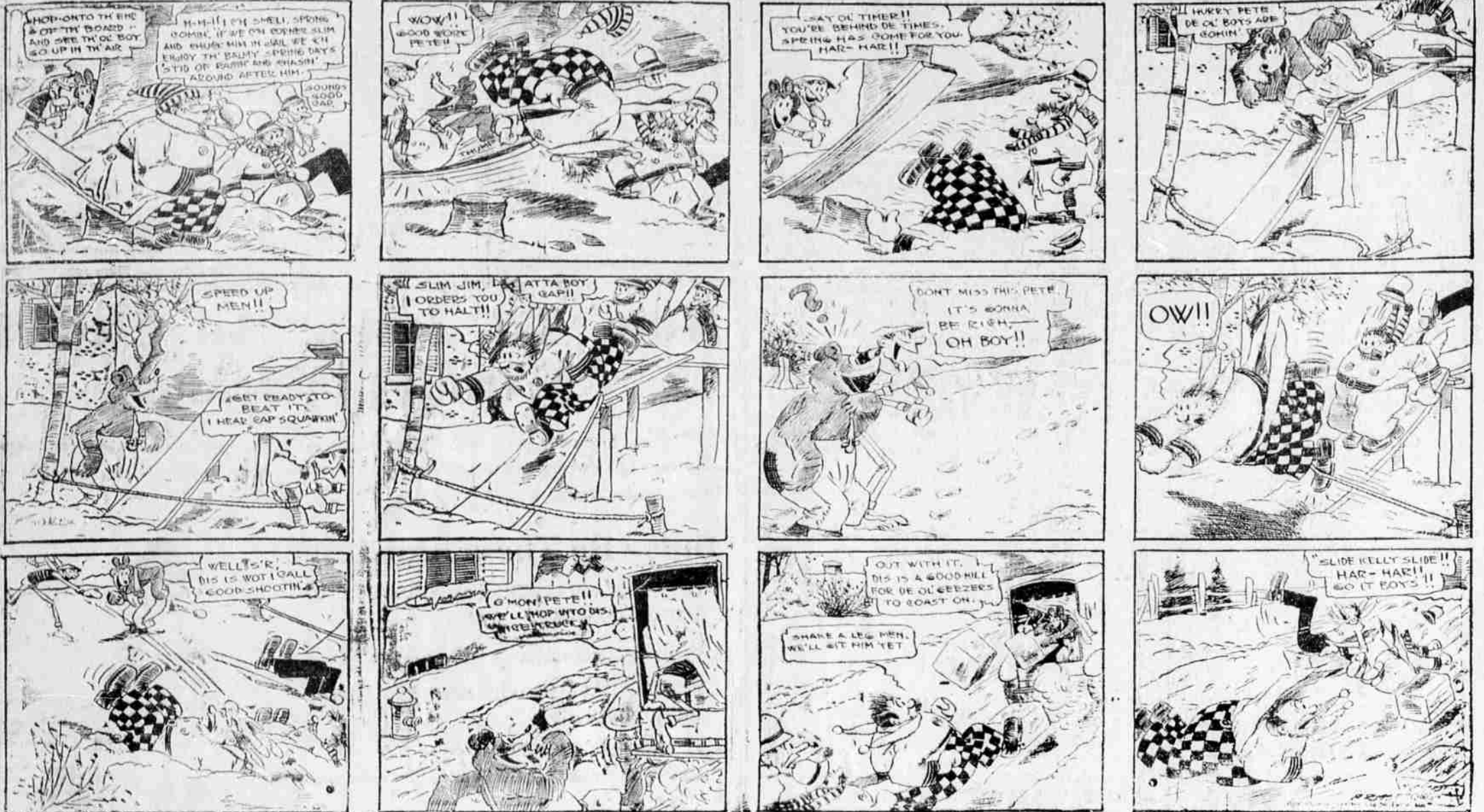




American Legion

HOSPITAL DAY HONORS NURSE

CHICAGO, (INS)—Hospital authorities throughout America have completed preparations for the celebration, May 12, of the sixtieth and fourth anniversary of the birth of Florence Nightingale, "Angel of the Crimea." The recently issued preliminary report of the biennial hospital census of the United States revealed that the average patient entering a hospital is sure to be ready to return to his home or to his job in 12.4 days.

The building permits issued during the month of April totaled \$250,000. The most pretentious structures started this month is the four-story Charles Nield hotel, to cost \$75,000. Another is the Clatsop investment block at Twelfth and Commercial streets, costing \$45,000.

Building permits for May promise to be much larger than for the preceding month, as the business block, which will include the new Johnson & Van Horn theater, will entail an expenditure of more than \$200,000.
